Take turns reading pages in a chapter with someone else, then read the rest of the book together or by yourself.

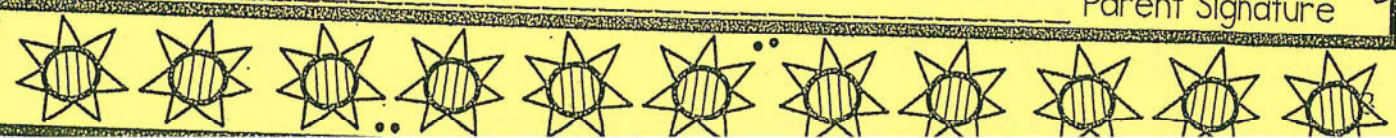

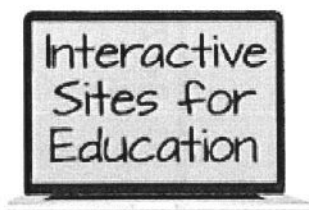
