
Advanced Placement U.S. History (AP) Summer Reading Assignments

Please note: Advanced Placement courses are rigorous and require students to learn as much as an introductory college course on the subject. To ensure that students are ready for this challenge, preparation in the summer prior to the course provides background knowledge and information that is necessary for students to succeed in the coursework.

APUSH is a survey course, and the volume of content (over 400 years) that we are expected to cover in about 8 months is a daunting task. This book is a well-written and concise summary of American history. The value of this assignment will become apparent to you as we get into the course. This assignment will help you succeed in APUSH.

- 1) **Skim the Introduction.** These skills and components of the course and exam will be discussed indepthly in class, but will be difficult to fully understand until we cover these concepts in class.
- 2) Read and annotate (highlight, write in the margins, etc.) Unit 1 & 2 which is Chapters 1-3 (pgs. 1-67). Answer multiple choice questions at the end of these chapters.
- 3) For each chapter, write a 10-15 sentence summary. Focus on the BIG IDEAS concerning Native Americans, black Americans, women, land, immigration and migration, economic, political, and social changes and developments of society. Summaries must be typed in a Google Doc and submitted to your teacher the first day of school.

Source: Report from an association of churches in Connecticut, 1812

The General Association of Connecticut, taking into consideration the undue consumption of ardent spirits ¹ in this State . . . , have considered it as their duty to submit . . . the following recommendations.

. . . To Farmers, Mechanics, and Manufacturers we recommend earnest and prudent exertion to diminish the quantity of ardent spirits consumed in their several employments, by the substitution of other palatable 2 and nutritious drinks, and by giving additional compensation, if necessary, to laborers who will dispense entirely with the use of ardent spirits. . . .

Let the attention of the public then be called up to this subject. . . . The word and the providence of God afford the most consoling prospect of success.

"[The Standard Oil Trust] is the most perfectly developed trust in existence. . . . Source: Jane Addams, social reformer, "Democracy or Militarism," speech given in Chicago, 1899.

Some of us were beginning to hope that . . . we were ready to accept the peace ideal . . . to recognize that . . . the man who irrigates a plain [is] greater than he who lays it waste. Then came the Spanish war, with its gilt and lace and tinsel, and again the moral issues are confused with exhibitions of brutality. For ten years I have lived in a neighborhood which is by no means criminal, and yet during last October and November we were startled by seven murders within a radius of ten blocks. A little investigation of details and motives . . . made it not in the least difficult to trace the murders back to the influence of the war. . . . The newspapers, the theatrical posters, the street conversations for weeks had to do with war and bloodshed. The little children on the street played at war, . . . killing Spaniards. The humane instinct . . . gives way, and the barbaric instinct asserts itself.
